Titles In Honor of Veterans Day Available at Hartford Public Library

In honor of Veterans Day, Hartford Public Library is recommending books in its collection. A display of Veterans-related materials can be found outside the Hartford History Center on the third floor of the Downtown Library.

Titles include:

The Odyssey of Sergeant Jack Brennan, is a graphic novel by Bryan Doerries, about a Marine Corps sergeant who shares the story of Homer's *Odyssey* with his squad in Afghanistan on their last night in country.

Hard Cold Winter: a Van Shaw Novel. Glen Erik Hamilton second novel in the series finds former Army Ranger Van Shaw confronting his criminal past in a dangerous journey

Preparation for the Next Life is a novel by Atticus Lish about the romance between a physically and emotionally damaged Iraq war vet and an undocumented Chinese immigrant.

In Conflict: Iraq War Veterans Speak Out On Duty, Loss, and the Fight To Stay Alive, a nonfiction book by Yvonne Latty that features the stories of two dozen veterans from all military branches who served in the Iraqi War.

Walking Point: From the Ashes of the Vietnam War is a memoir by Perry A. Ulander about his one-year tour of duty in 1969.

Keep Your Head Down: Vietnam, the Sixties, and a Journey of Self-Discovery is a memoir by Doug Anderson about his tour of duty in the late 1960s as a navy corpsman with the 1st Marine Division in Vietnam.

The Untold War: Inside the Hearts, Minds, and Souls of Our Soldiers is by philosopher and psychoanalyst Nancy Sherman taken from her sessions with 40 soldiers who served in Vietnam, Iraq and Afghanistan.

The War Comes Home: Washington's Battle against America's Veterans by Aaron Glantz is an expose about how American veterans of Iraq and Afghanistan are treated when they return home.
